

- Do I have the "competence" to tackle this matter?
- If not, how do I handle it?




ABA Model Rule 1.1 ("A lawyer shall provide competent representation to a client."); TDRPC 1.01 ("A lawyer shall not accept or continue employment in a legal matter In which the lawyer knows or should know is beyond the lawyer's competence...")

## Take A (Daggum) Breath.

Lacking ethical "competence" does **not** make you a bad lawyer.

### Competence Is Specific.



### **Matter-by-Matter Call**

- Factors for competence include "the preparation and study the lawyer is able to give the matter."
  - -ABA Model Rule 1.1 cmt. 1
- "A lawyer's workload should be controlled so that each matter can be handled with diligence and competence."
  - -TDRPC 1.01 cmt. 6



# **Competence Bare Minimum**

- Legal knowledge, skill and training
- Thoroughness on the law and facts
- Preparation and attentiveness
- Illness affects the last two!

#### **Competence Factors**

- How complex or specialized is the matter?
- Experience and training in the field?
- How much time can you give it?
- Can you associate another lawyer?



# Competence Problems: Malpractice Examples

- Bad legal advice given
- No legal advice given, when required
- Litigation poorly managed or prepared
- SOL lapsed

### **Cover Options**

- Bring in another lawyer to help.
- Pass off temporarily.



ABA Model Rule 1.1 cmt. 1; TDRPC 1.01(a)(1) (lawyer who is not competent may associate in another lawyer who is)


### Your Setup Matters.

#### **Solo Lawyer**

- Go it alone?
- Hire?
- Associate another law firm?

#### **Law Firm**


- What do you delegate?
- Is anyone else competent in your practice area?



ABA Model Rule 1.1 cmt. 1 (lawyer who is not competent may associate in another lawyer who is); TDRPC 1.01(a)(1) (same)

### **Spin-Up Costs**


- Cover lawyer doesn't have to be an expert today.
- Lawyer can hit the books.
- But in Texas, you can't stick it to the client – you must eat those costs.



ABA Model Rule 1.1 cmt. 2 (lawyer can study up); TDRPC 1.01 cmt. 4 (lawyer's study up time can't cause the client "unusual delay or expense")


#### The Hit-by-a-Bus Rule

- Don't leave all the goods only between your ears.
- Paper it!
- Think timelines, jury charge, claim and defense analysis, etc.



#### Press Pause.

- Look at everything with your best guesses on your health.
  - Can I handle each matter?
  - Can I handle everything I plan to do altogether?
  - Where do I need a hand?
  - Can I get a hand?
- If your health changes, look back again.



#### Don't Wait, Communicate.



#### Talk To Your Client.

- You can't just wheel in another lawyer.
- You need your client's prior "informed consent."

## **Big Guns**


- Terminate or decline the representation.
- Wind down.



ABA Model Rule 1.16(a)(2) ("shall withdraw" if physical or mental condition materially impairs representation); TDRPC 1.15(a)(1) (lawyer "shall" end the representation if it would violate the TDRCP)

# Designate A Custodian Attorney.

- Texas Bar lets you designate a "Custodian Attorney."
- Custodian handles your client files and property.
- No designation, difficult court process.






#### **Partners and Managing Lawyers**

Make sure a firm has measures to give "reasonable assurance" that lawyers follow rules.

#### **Texas Rules**

- Partners and supervisors cannot "knowingly" let another lawyer slide.
- But still, we should feel a "moral compunction."






